Safety Curriculum

All students are potentially at-risk of violence in today's society. All students need to learn pro-social skills to be able to mature into productive adults. Pro-social skills curriculum is delivered to students starting at the pre-school level and threaded through the students' educational career.



Positive Behavior and Intervention System (PBIS)

A program that gives schools capacity, information and technical assistance for identifying, adapting and sustaining effective school-wide disciplinary practices.



DARE

This anti-drug curriculum is delivered by Police Officers in the 5th grade.



District Behavior Interventionist

Personnel hired by the district to support schools with students who exhibit at-risk behaviors. This individual has been trained in assessments of behavior, behavior planning, Crisis Management Training among others.



Anti-Bullying Program

Partnering with our Family Resource Center, training on bullying is offered to our K-5th grade students. The school guidance counselor teaches about the different types of bullying and what to do if you are bullied. We have bully boxes located throughout the building where students may drop in notes about a bullying incident.

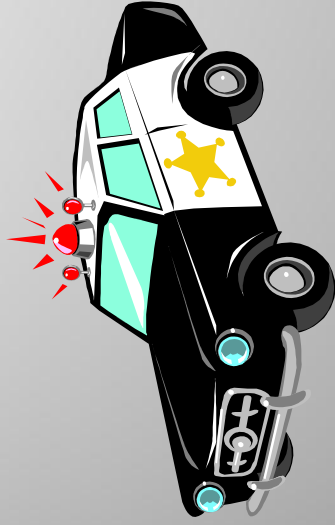
School Guidance Counselor

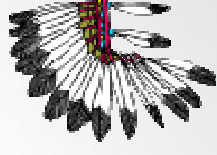
